



## Premiere of the TV Series Svenska Bönder

On 3 February, the TV series Svenska Bönder premieres on Viaplay and TV3. The series follows everyday life on five Swedish farms, offering a close look at where our food comes from. Lantmännen is a partner in the initiative, which aims to increase knowledge about Swedish agriculture and highlight the crucial role farmers play in Sweden's food supply.

Swedish farmers are essential to ensuring that food reaches our tables every day. Despite growing interest in Swedish food and the increasing importance of food security, the number of farmers is declining — making the need for greater understanding of and interest in the profession more important than ever.
